## Short and long term objectives

The objective of the Foundation over the coming year is to increase its range of charitable programs through the promotion of the Centrecorp Foundation No Interest Loan Scheme (NILS).

The NILS program will commence on 1st July 2011 and is expected to attract many applications for loans from indigenous people of Alice Springs and progressively expand into the more remote regions of Central Australia.

## Principal activities

The company's principal activity in the course of the financial period was the provision of charitable donations to indigenous persons of Central Australia which is its primary objective.

The company is presently wholly funded by Centrecorp Aboriginal Investment Corporation to a minimum of \$800,000 per annum and it is anticipated that it will generate sufficient donation applications of merit to donate those funds less administrative costs.
